
[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of Virginia County of Bedford: Sct.

I Obediah Trant son and one of the heirs at law of Lawrence Trant do upon oath testify and declare to the best of my knowledge and belief that Lawrence Trant did entered the Army in 1776 for the term of during the war, and acted in the capacity of Captain in the Regiment Numbered Fourteen under the command of Colonel William Davis of the Virginia line on Continental establishment and that he continued in this service aforesaid until the close of the war. I further declare that I have never received a warrant for the bounty land promised to the said Lawrence Trant on the part of the United States; no [nor] do I believe that he ever received it or transferred his claim to it in any manner whatsoever. Therefore
