



[abstract]

The file contains a power of attorney wherein Mary Barnett, wife of Schuyler Barnett of Lincoln County, Kentucky and Margaret P. Worthington of Mercer County, Kentucky state that they are the only surviving heirs of Lieutenant Stephen Slade who served in the NC Continental Line. The power of attorney is dated January 19<sup>th</sup> 1830 and appoints John Kincaid as their attorney to claim whatever land bounty might be due them as heirs of said Slade. A letter in the file dated May 23, 1835 from George M. Long makes reference to a commission in the possession of one of Slade's daughters, the commission is dated 23<sup>rd</sup> of January 1781, is signed by Thomas Mifflin, Esqr., President of Congress, and appoints Slade a lieutenant in the NC Line.
