

(p4) I Daniel Earlywine [indecipherable]¹ Son and one of the heirs at Law of David Earlywine Deceased do upon oath testify and declare to the best of my Knowledge and belief that my late father David Earlywine was an enlisted soldier for the period of during the War of the Revolution in the Virginia line continental establishment and as I believe served to the end of the said war. I also do further testify and declare that I have never received a warrant from the United States for bounty land due my said Deceased father nor do I believe that he ever during his life issued the Same or transferred his right to it in any manner whatever - Therefore - Know all men by these presents that I Daniel Earlywine before said do hereby [same indecipherable word as above] as aforesaid do hereby constitute and appoint Henry Northrup my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name and for my use to ask demand and receive from the Secretary of War of the United States a warrant for the Bounty Land due me and my co heirs in right of my said deceased father and my said attorney is hereby authorized and empowered to constitute and appoint one or more substitutes or attorneys under law for the special purposes above named and the same to revoke at will. peace in and for the County of Nicholas aforesaid, duly commissioned and qualified and that full faith and credit is due to all such his official acts and "that his attestation in due form" and that I do further certify that at a County Court held for the County aforesaid on the 25th day of January 1830 satisfactory evidence was adduced in Open Court, to prove that Phebe Rickey, wife of Noah Rickey, Susan Gonce, wife of John Gonce, Elizabeth Feeback, wife of Jacob Feeback, Daniel Earlywine, Rebecca Gonce wife of Samuel Gonce, George Nancy & Jesse, Christina and Mahala Earlywine are the children and only heirs at law of Daniel Early line late of said County Deceased, who was said to have been a soldier of the Virginia line of the Army of the revolution as appears of record in this office.
