Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

A Warrant for 4666 2/3 acres was issued to Nathaniel Pendleton as a Captain for Seven years service.

S/ W Price, Regr.  
May 11, 1808

I do hereby certify and declare that I entered into the Company of Captain Stevenson [probably Hugh Stephenson] of Berkeley County Virginia in the month of June 1775, and went with that Company, which was a Company of riflemen to Boston where we arrived in August following – That I continued in the service and was appointed a Lieutenant in a Company of Riflemen Commanded by Captain Long in Colonel Stevenson's Regiment of Riflemen, which Company was raised in Virginia, and I was taken prisoner by the Enemy at the Surrender of Fort Washington [November 16, 1776], and was made a Captain in the Virginia Continental Line in March 1777, and immediately upon being exchanged I became an aide-de-camp to General Greene [Nathanael Greene], in which capacity I served and received pay until November 1783, when the Army was disbanded, which makes the whole period of my Service in the Revolutionary Army eight years and five months –
