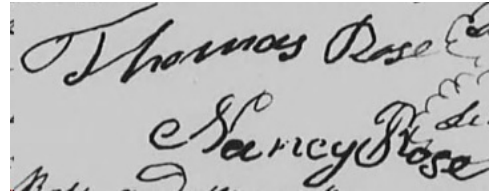
Bounty Land Claim for Van Davis BLWt2044-100 VA
Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris. Revised 2 June 2019.

State of Virginia }
County of Harrison Solecit }

I, Nancy Rose heir at law of Van Davis do, upon oath, testify and declare, to the best of my knowledge and belief, that Van Davis did enter the service in 1782, for the term of during the war and served as a private in Armonds Regiment or Corps [sic: Legion of Charles Armand BLWt2291-850] under the command of Colonel Armond, of the Continental line; and that he continued in the service aforesaid until the close of the war

I further declare, that I have never received a warrant for bounty land promised to Van Davis on the part of the United States; nor do I believe that he ever received it, or transferred his claim to it in any manner whatsoever : therefore, I claim the same as his heiress in fee at law

[There follows a power of attorney assigned by Thomas Rose and Nancy Rose to John J. Allen of Harrison County dated 16 June 1834. Certified by Jacob Coplin, a Justice of the Peace.]

At a court held for Harrison county, June Term 1834 satisfactory evidence was adduced in court, to prove that Nancy Rose formerly Nancy Davis wife of Thomas Rose of this County and State aforesaid is the only child and heiress at law in fee of Van Davis deceased late a private soldier in the Regiment or Legion or corps of Armonds that he died with out a will and never was a pensioner

I, David Davisson Clerk of the county court, do certify, that the above evidence is taken from the records in my office.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto affixed my official seal, this 19th day of June 1834.



I Nancy Rose Heir at Law of Van Davies do upon oath testify and declare to the best of my knowledge and belief that Van Davies did enter the Service in 1782 for the term of during the war and served as a private in Armand Regiment or corps under the Command of Colonel Armand of the Continental line, and that he continued in the service [several undeciphered words] I have never received a Warrant for the Bounty Land promised to Van Davies on the part of the State of Virginia, nor do I believe that he ever received it or transferred his Claim to it in any manner whatsoever. Therefore I claim the same as his heires in fee at Law this 10th day of June 1834
