Pension Application of Thomas Fisher BLWt2071-100

[Accomack County VA, 1 Aug 1834]

The deposition of Zadok Bayly [Zadock Bayley, pension application S37696] a Revolutionary pensioner who say he was well acquainted with Thomas Fisher of this County – that he served with him in the 11th Va. Regiment to the end of the war or until transfered at Winchester to some other Reg't. & discharged at Winchester Barracks under & by Gen'l. Muhlenburg [sic: Peter Muhlenberg] – & that he was the same Thomas Fisher of whom Betsy or Elizabeth Northam, Henry F. Fisher & others are heirs.

Zadok hisXmark Bayly

At a Court held for Accomack County on the 27th day of August 1834

It is ordered to be certified that it appears to the Court by satisfactory evidence that Tally W. Fisher, Henry F. Fisher, Susan Northam, Betsy Northam wife of William Northam (of E.), Delighty Christopher, John Northam, Henry Northam & Sally Hireman[?] are the only heirs at Law of Thomas Fisher a Soldier in the Virginia Continental Line in the Revolutionary War.

NOTE: A size roll of noncommissioned officers and privates compiled at Albemarle Old Courthouse lists the following: Thom's Fisher/ age 30/ height 5' 8½"/ brown complexion/ residing in Accomack County/ enlisted Dec 1779 for the duration of the war.
