

[Note: The Virginia State Library has no documents relating to this veteran posted in its online digital collection. There is an entry for George Lee Turberville in its index of bounty land grants but no documents in that file are posted online.]

[Note: According to a document found by Leon Harris in the file of Obadiah Griffin S8614, this officer spelled his surname Turbervile. His apparent signature which appears in Griffin's file as follows:

A handwritten signature in cursive script, appearing to read "George Lee Turberville". The ink is dark and the background is light, with some speckling.

I use qualified language as to the above signature and how the officer spelled his surname because I've found in a number of contemporary documents that clerks or others signed certain documents on behalf of others and, on occasion, the surrogate signer used his own more imaginative way of spelling the names of those for whom he signed documents.]
