

Sick Quarters at Mrs Williams on stono [Stono River SC] December 1<sup>st</sup> 1782



State of Delaware } The Deposition of Jacob Furbee of the Town of Dover aged Forty Four years,  
Kent County } Late a Corporal under the Command of Captain Paul Quenouault of the Delaware  
Regiment in the army of the United States, Taken before me John Lowber Esq one of the Justices of the  
peace for said County, Deposeth and Saith, That Paul Quenouault Inlisted in the army of the united States  
when the Delaware Regiment was first Raised That he served under him as Lieutenant and afterward as  
Captain, that he continued in the army untill some time in December One Thousand Seven Hundred and  
Eighty Two when the Remnant of the Delaware Regiment had orders to march to the Delaware State from  
Ashly [sic: Ashley] River in South Carolina, and When the said Regiment marched Captain Paul  
Quenouault was Left behind sick, from an Injury Received in an engagement with the Enemy some short  
time before – and about the Third Day of our March we Received Information of the Death of the said  
Captain Paul Quenouault and further this Deponent saith not.  
Sworn and Subscribed before me the 27<sup>th</sup> day of December  
1802. John Lowber



NOTES:

The file also contains Paul Quenouault's commission as Captain to commence on 1 Jan 1781,  
signed by Samuel Huntington, President of Congress, on 1 June 1781.

Also in the file are the following:

A certificate that letters of administration on the estate of Paul Queanault were granted on 2 Aug 1783  
to Sarah Queanault and James Clark.

A petition dated 28 May 1785 by James Clark to be appointed guardian of Thomas Quenauoult, age 14,  
son of Capt. Paul Quenauoult.

A certificate that letters of administration on the estate of Sarah Queanault were granted on 31 Dec 1793  
to Elijah Barratt.

Letters of administration on the estate of Thomas Queanault granted on 7 Aug 1802 to John Grigg and  
James Clark.

A certificate by John Grigg that he was the sole heir of Sarah Queanault, deceased heir of Thomas  
Queanault, the deceased son and sole heir of Paul Queanault.

Testimony the John Griff and Sarah Quenouault were brother and sister.
