To the Honorable the President and Members of the Senate
of the State of South Carolina

The Memorial of Joseph Brevard, respectfully Sheweth

That your Memorialist being one of the Associate Judges of the said State, is expressly forbidden by law to quit the State without permission first obtained from his Excellency the Governor thereof for the time being, upon pain of forfeiting his office and that the Governor is authorized to grant leave of absence only in case of sickness, a cause which happily for your Memorialist he has not to allege: and your Memorialist being desirous of leaving the State for a short space of time, on the following business, is under necessity of making the present application.


Your Memorialist having served as a commission Officer in the Continental Army, in the Revolutionary War, had granted to him in that quality, by the State of North Carolina, a considerable tract of Land, situate on the River Tennessee, in the now State of Tennessee, the benefit of which Grant he is in danger of being deprived of from causes and circumstances, which it would be tedious, and is unnecessary to detail and explain; – and your Memorialist being advised, and being under a serious impression that his presence in the State of Tennessee will be important & necessary in order to ensure the effect of the Grant aforesaid, according to the intent thereof, therefore prays your Honorable house to grant him permission to leave the State for the space of Three months, between the months of May and October of the next year, or the year following.

The Honorable Senate will please to observe that very little if any Official duty will be required to be performed by your Memorialist during the time for which he craves leave of absence.
