[This veteran gave an affidavit in support of the pension claim of [John Brown S39242](#). The affidavit reads as follows:

These are to Certify that Mr John
Brown ^{was} a Soldier in the fifth Reg^t of
South Carolina Continental troops and Immediately
after the Battle at Savannah he was trans-
ferred to my Company in the 3^d Reg^t.
Commanded by Col. ^{William Henderson} and
that he faithfully Served his time as Good
Soldier in the same, and after we were
taken prisoners at the fall of Charleston
he continued as a waiter to me until the
Troops were Discharged at Charleston where
he had his Discharge, he is a man about
five feet eight or ten inches high of a Sallow
Complexion with brown hair well made
and at that time ^{was} Eighteen years of age
and that it is the same person who has
called on me for this Certificate at this time
Dated Dec^r 1793 - Jesse Baker

These are to Certify that Mr. John Brown was a soldier in the fifth Regiment of South Carolina Continental troops and Immediately after the Battle at Savannah he was transferred to my Company in the third Regiment Commanded by Colonel [illegible name, may be William Henderson] and That he faithfully Served his time a Good Soldier in the same, and after we were taken prisoners at the fall of Charleston he continued as a waiter to me until the Troops were Discharged at Charleston where he had his Discharge, he is a man about 5 feet Eight or ten

inches high of a sallow Complexion with Brown hair each made and at that time about Eighteen
years of age – and that it is the same person who has called on me for this Certificate at this time.
