

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

Know all Men by these Presents, that I Albridgton Jones of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia have this day bargained and sold, and by these presents do bargain, sell and assign over to Thomas D Harris of the County of Henrico and State of Virginia all my right, title, and interest in and to two hundred acres of land, due me in consideration of my services in the Army of the United States, to the end of the late war with Great-Britain, under the command of \_\_\_ agreeable to an act of Congress, and I do moreover request, order and direct Henry Dearborn, Esquire, Secretary of War for the time being, or his successors, to issue to Thomas D Harris his heirs or assigns, in his or their own name as assignee of me, the said Albridgton Jones a warrant for the land aforesaid, and on receipt of the same, I do hereby ratify and affirm any receipt or other instrument in writing, that he the said Thomas D Harris may necessarily sign, or procure to be signed, in touching the premises aforesaid, as fully as I could do, if I was personally present. In Testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of January eighteen hundred & seven.
