I was well acquainted with Major William Croghan during the Revolutionary war - he was appointed a Captain in the 8th Virginia Regiment Continental establishment, early in the year 1776, and as well as I am able to recollect, prior to April of the same year. he was promoted in the course of service to the Rank of Major, and continued in Service until the termination of the war on the 15th November 1783.

Given under my hand at Richmond this 7th day of September 1808.

By the books in this office it appears, that a warrant issued to Mr Croghan, for 533 1/3 acres for services as a Major in the Continental line from Feb 7 1776 till 29 of November 1782

It also appears that a warrant was issued to Mr Croghan for his seven years service as a Major 833 1/3 acres

I entered into the Service of the State of Virginia as Captain in the 8th Virginia the 17th day of February 1776, was promoted to the Rank of Major of the 4th Virginia Regiment the 16th of May 1778, and continued to Act as such to the end of the War, I have received Land warrants for seven years service, be so obliging as to Deliver the bearer Charles Copland Esquire a Warrant for my Services from the expiration of the seven years (the 17th of February 1783) to the end of the War and you will much oblige
