



Bounty Land Claim for Abner Quarles BLWt548-100

This is to certify, that the bearer Abner Quarles was enlisted in the serveis of the United States Nov'br. 1776 and has continued for the war, in the Cont'l. Vign'a. [Continental Virginia] Line to this date June 26, 1783. Parker Cap't. Virg'a. Line.

A handwritten signature in cursive script, appearing to read "A. Parker", with the date "1783" written above it.

THESE are to CERTIFY that the bearer hereof Abner Quarles in the 14th [or 4th] Virginia regiment, having faithfully served the United States seven years and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.

Given at the war office the 28th day of June 1783
B Lincoln [Gen. Benjamin Lincoln]

THE within CERTIFICATE shall not avail the bearer as a discharge, until the ratification of the definitive treaty of peace; previous to which time, and until proclamation thereof shall be made, he is to be considered as being on furlough.

There must be an order Accompany this discharge attested by a Magistrate of the County in which Mr. Quarles lives or by an Officer under whom he immediately served to Obtain his Certificate
