Bounty Land Warrant of John Eustace BLWt682-200 VA
Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris. 20 Jan 2014.

[The file jacket is inscribed "B.L.Wt.682-200 Capt/ Issued Jan. 27, 1800 to William Eustace, heir./ No papers." The file contains an inquiry dated 29 Jul 1928 regarding Capt. John Eustace who was killed at the Battle of Germantown on 4 Oct 1777, stating that his heir, William Eustace, was probably his father, living in Fauquier County. [Revolutionary bounty-warrant records in the Library of Virginia](#) include a document for a Capt. John Eustace, but the online image is very faint. An attempt at transcription follows.]

I hereby certify that Capt. John Eustace [illegible word] In the Continental Service in the year 1775 and was kill'd in the Battle of German Town the 4th of October 1777 Given under my hand this 18th September 1783
