

Crandall[?] Hall April 30 1790


I have made application to the Counsel for my land warrants & their reply is I must git a Certificate from under my Colos hands that I served during the War before they can be had. I request it as a particular favor you woud Certify the Services during the war which my Servant will take to Richmond & deliver to Mr Dawson one of the Council & [two undeciphered words]. I am Dr Sir with best Comp'ts to Mrs Temple
