Dear Sir [Colo. Thomas Meriwether, Richmond] This will be handed you by Lieutenant Glasscock who I beg leave to introduce to your acquaintance as a particular friend of mine.

Mr. Glascock wishes to obtain his Warrant for Land as an Officer in the 1<sup>st</sup> Regiment Light Dragoons, he was appointed a Lieutenant in that Regiment the 1<sup>st</sup>[?] Septem 1780 and served such, until he was taken Prisoner the 6 of June following [date unclear] – he was in the last arrangement contrary to his desire deranged on account of being a Prisoner. I have been thus particular in mentioning the circumstances in consequence of a conversation that hapen'd between you [one or two illegible words] some time since. The arrangement of our Regiment in my Opinion was unjust and on every principal of Justice Mr Glasscock ought to have been arranged
