"Lawson, Hugh

his name appears on a list of applicants for invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of Georgia submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on March 2, 1795 and printed in the American State Papers class [?] 9, page 169

Rank; Captain

Regt. Col. Twigg's militia

Disability, Wounded in the right shoulder by a musket ball

When and where disabled, 1780, Augusta

Remarks; Militia

Evidence incomplete, viz. 1<sup>st</sup> No evidence to prove his being wounded in the Actual line of his duty, in the service of the United States

2<sup>nd</sup>, the examining physicians did not state the degree of his disability

On the list of pensioners, printed in 1835, vol 3, page 9 of list of invalid pensioner's paid at Savannah Georgia Agency whose residence could not be obtaining as their papers were burned in 1800 and 1814, appears Hugh Lawson: Captain, annual allowance \$120 commencement of pension March 4 1795, Act February 2, 1798.

Died February 20, 1802

Sums received \$720"
