

Southern Campaigns American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Pension Application of Henry Karr (Kerr) GA18
Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

PA [sic: GA]

[On the file jacket "Dis," short for "disability," appears in place of a file number. "GA18" is unique to this transcription. Fold3.com has this file among the applicants who served from Pennsylvania. There is no original application, but only an abstract dated 7 Jan 1907, which is transcribed as follows.]

Karr, Henry

His name appears on a list of applicants for Invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of Georgia submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on March 2, 1795 and printed in the American State Papers, class 9, page 169.

Rank: Captain

Reg't: Col. [Elijah] Clarke's militia

Disability: The motion of his left shoulder considerably impaired, and that of his whole arm much weakened in consequence of a wound by a musket ball

When and where disabled: October, 1780, South Carolina [see endnote]

Residence: Greene county.

Remarks: Militia.

Evidence complete, excepting that the examining physicians do not state the degree of his disability. allowed as Henry Kerr in printed list of 1835, Ga. Inv. p. 9.

NOTE: F. B. Heitmans's *Historical Register of Officer of the Continental Army During the War of the Revolution* has the following entry:

Karr, Henry (Ga). Captain Georgia Militia; wounded at Fish Dam Ford, 9th November, 1780.
