His name appears on a list of applicants for invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of North Carolina, submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on February 28, 1795 and printed in the American State Papers class 9, page 164

Rank: Private

Regiment: 2nd North Carolina

Disability; Wounded by a musket ball, which broke the bone of his right arm, and occasioned two of his fingers to be contracted into the palm of his hand, whereby he is prevented from holding any kind of an instrument or tool.

When and where disabled; May, 1780, Siege of Charleston.

Resident; Hertford County

To what pension in title; one-half

Remarks; Enlisted 19th of May 1777, for three years.

Evidence Complete.

Note. This does not belong in S12699 of James Christian of Cumberland County North Carolina Invalid list, that man was in first North Carolina Regiment and pensioned from March 4, 1789 nor can it be proved that it belonged to James Christian 2nd of Wake County North Carolina. Invalid list, he was pensioned from March 4, 1789, no service given
