[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of Tennessee County of Wilson } be it known that on this day came Benjamin Conn<sup>1</sup> & David Shaffer<sup>2</sup> Came before me James MCadow one of the acting Justices of the [peace] for said County and after being duly sworn depose and say that they and each of them were personally acquainted with Archibald Bogle<sup>3</sup> who was a Sergeant in Captain Allen's Company of the second Regt of the North Carolina Line [and] served in the Revolutionary war and the said Archibald Bogle died while in said service and left one bodily heir (viz.) Robert Bogle and his Estate descended to his son Robert Bogle they further say that they are both personally acquainted with the said Robert Bogle who they know to be the only Lawful heir and Representative of the said Archibald Bogle deceased who died as aforesaid while in said service. Sworn to and subscribed before me this 20<sup>th</sup> day of December 1820
