[In the place for the file number on the file jacket is written "Dis/ No papers," meaning that the file pertains to a disability pension, and the original records are lost (probably in an accidental fire in 1800). The following is a summary in the file.]

Sybert alias Syfat, Adam

His name appears on list of applicants for invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of Pennsylvania, submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on April 25, 1794, and printed in the American State Papers, class 9, page 99.

Rank: Private.

Regt: Congress

Disability: Wounded in both his legs by two musket balls, at the storming of one of Cornwallis's redoubts in Virginia, just before his capture [Redoubt 10 at Yorktown, 14 Oct 1781].

Where disabled: Virginia.

Residence: County of Philadelphia.

Remarks: This man is mustered in [Moses] Hazen's regiment, but date of enlistment not known.
