State of Mississippi Rankin County: On this 21st day of March 1853 before me the undersigned an Acting Justice of the Peace in and for said County personally appeared Sudduth Toles, who being duly sworn according to law declares that he is the only son and heir at law of James Toles deceased, who was a soldier of the Revolutionary Army of the United States under the command of General Washington, that he is informed and believes that his father James Toles, served in said war about 7 years, that he died in the State of Georgia in or about the year 1813, he further states that he is informed and believes that said James Toles was entitled to a pension for said services up to the period of his death that he believes that his father James Toles, has never applied for or up cane said pension in his lifetime, he further states that Parcilla Toles the widow of said James Toles, survived her husband James Toles, 15 years or thereabouts. And that he is informed and believes that his mother Parcilla Toles, was entitled to a pension as the widow of said soldier. And that she never applied for or received the same, he further states that this application is made to obtain the pension due the said James Toles & the said Parcilla Toles. And that he has no documentary evidence of the service of said Soldier but solely relies upon a confirmation of his statements by the muster rolls of the Army of the United States in the Revolutionary War aforesaid. And he further Constitutes and appoints Terrence M. Gowan Attorney to prosecute said Claim and receive the Certificate that may be issued.
