State of Florida Columbia County: Be it remembered that at a regular Term of the Circuit Court, begun and held in & for said County, and in the Eastern Circuit of said State at the Court House in the term [sic, town?] of Alligator in said County, on Monday the 13th day of May A.D. 1850

Present the Honorable Thomas Douglass Judge of said Court

And be it remembered that the term aforesaid on Wednesday the 15th day of May 1850 among other proceedings were the following to wit:

State of Florida Columbia County: SS

On the 15th day of May A.D. 1850 personally appeared in Open Court, before the Circuit Court for Columbia County, Eastern Circuit of Florida Littleberry berry Walker, aged eighty-three years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration: that he entered the service of the United States under the following named Officers, and served as here in stated. He served one year under William West who was a Captain in a company in the year 1783, he was drafted into said Service, the place of his service was Liberty County in the State of Georgia. He further states on his oath that he has no Documentary evidence and that he knows of no person whose testimony he can procure, who can testify to his service.

[He] Here by relinquishes every Claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares his name is not on the list pension roll of the Agency of any State.
