Pension Application of George Whetsel (Whitzell, Wetzel) R11492

Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

[The original application is missing from the folder, probably having been removed by District Attorney Washington G. Singleton for his investigation of pension applications from Monongalia, Harrison, Lewis and other counties in present West Virginia. For details see pension application S6111 of David W. Sleeth. A card in the file refers to Thomas P. Ray, who was the Clerk of Court for Monongalia County and probably prepared Wetzel's application. The federal census for Monongalia County dated 19 Sep 1850 lists George Whetsel, 83, born in Maryland.]

David Youst says he has known Whetsel for twenty five years - is a cousin of his by marriage - previous to the passage of the Pension Law of June 1832, has frequently heard Whitsel say that he himself was not in the war of the Revolution, but that his father was - Whetsel cant exceed sixty years of age - In testimony that the forgoing statement is true I have hereto subscribed my name Nov. 5, 1834
