Pension Application of Reuben Bramblet R1152

State of South Carolina }
Laurens district } On this [blank] day of October 1832 personally appeared in open Court before the Judge of the Court of Sessions and Common Pleas of said State & district now sitting Reuben Bramblet a resident of Laurens District So Carolina aged seventy five years who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June the 7th 1832. That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated – He entered the service under Capt. Elias Edmunds, in a company of Artillery of the Virginia Militia as a drafted soldier but does not recollect the time he entered the service – Shortly afterwards he was delivered over to Col Elias Edmunds of the Virginia Militia to Waggon, and continued in that employment Halling Flour and grain & other Articles to Fredericksburgh for about Eight months. Was in no engagement. He resided in Fauqueir County Virginia when he entered the service. He has no documentary evidence and knows of no person, whose testimony he can procure, who can testify to his service.

I hereby relinquish every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declare that my name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any State –

I was born on the [blank] day of March 1758.

I have no Register of my age

I was living when called into service in Fauquier County Virginia, I removed to South Carolina in 1794 where I have lived ever since (in the district of Laurens)

I was drafted –

I have no recollection of the names of the Regular officers who served with me if any –

I was discharged at Fauquier Count, Virginia by Col. Edmunds, and have the discharge in my possession, which is hereunto attached

I do hereby certify that the Bearer Reuben Brambets Waggon & team is now imploy'd in the service of the United States by the Commissioners of Fauquier County to draw Grain &c to the Quarter Master in Fredericksburg Certifyd by 28th Sept 1780 Wm. Edmonds [illegible abbreviation]

NOTES:

William Edmonds was County Lieutenant of the Fauquier County Militia.

On 18 April 1855 Lewis Bramblet assigned power of attorney to obtain any benefits available for the service of Reuben Bramblet.
