

Pension Application of Charles Davis R13594 VA Half Pay

State of Illinois } Before me Antoine Dufour an acting Justice of the Peace for Randolph County
Randolph County } & State aforesaid Personly appeared Joseph Page a Citizen of said County &
State aforesaid & made oath in due form of law that he was acquainted with Charles Davis who was a
Lieutenant in the State line of Virginia in the Revolutionary war, in the month of February one thousand
seven hundred & seventy eight, who served as Interpreter until the close of the war, which was in the
year one thousand eight hundred & eighty three, in George Rodgers Clarks [sic: George Rogers Clark's]
Regiment in the Illinois Service. Deponent is now eighty one years old.
Sworn and subscribed to before me this 2nd November 1833

NOTE: On 28 Oct 1833 Michael Davis of Randolph County IL assigned power of attorney to obtain
benefits for the service of Charles Davis, Sr. as a Lieutenant in the Revolutionary War. A court document
dated 3 Dec 1833 stated that Charles Davis, father of Michael Davis, died about 1815.
