

Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements

Pension Application of Charles Deklaman R13678

Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

At a Court held for Norfolk County the 15<sup>th</sup> day of March 1852.

The Court doth order it to be certified that satisfactory evidence has been adduced to prove that James Snyder, William Snyder, John H. Snyder and Mary Ann Bell who is now Mary Ann Cain are the only heirs at law now living of Major Charles Deklaman of the Virginia State line in the time of the Revolutionary War.

Ordered that it be certified that it appears to the Court by satisfactory evidence that Charles Deklaman was a major of the Virginia state line in the time of the Revolutionary War and that the said Charles Deklaman who was a major as aforesaid died in the County of Norfolk in the state of Virginia sometime in the Year of our Lord seventeen hundred and ninety five.

On the motion of William Snyder who made oath and together with James Snyder his security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five thousand dollars with condition according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said William Snyder (with the consent of the heirs of law) for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Charles Deklaman deceased (who was a major of the Virginia State line in the War of the Revolution) in due form.
