The Deposition of Capt Luke Ashburn [pension application W5649] taken as it Respects the Name of William George of Lancaster cty – Which sayeth that said George was in a company under Capt Beryman [possibly John Berryman] He then changed from that company and Enlisted under Capt Sely Saunders[sic: Celey Saunders] on Board of the schooner Lewis Gally for 2 years
This Deposition saith no more Luke hisXmark Ashburn
[25 April 1834]

The deposition of Thos. Currel [Thomas Currel] taken as it respects the name of William George of Lancaster Cty – Which sayeth that said George was in a company under Capt J. Berryman in which Company he served five years This deposition saith./ Tho hisXmark Currel
[5 Nov 1845]

Lancaster County Court February 16th 1846.

It is proven to the Satisfaction of the Court that William George who was engaged in the war of the Revolution died about the year 1800 leaving children Jesse George and Michael George.
