I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of Georgia County of Jackson: On this ___ May in the year 1854 personally appeared before Sterling G Davis an acting justice of the peace in and for said State and County Mrs. Margaret Carlisle a resident of Jackson County in the State of Georgia aged eighty-six years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the provisions made by the laws of the United States passed on the 16th day of April 1816 and also the laws of the United States passed 7th of July 1836 and also all other laws passed by the United States in favor of widows. That she is the widow of Hosea Carlisle who was a private in the company commanded by Captain H. Luttwsers [?] of the South Carolina Regiment in the old revolutionary war declared on the 4th of July 1776 and was mustered into service on or about __ 18__ and for Term of 12 months at __ South Carolina on or about __ and continued in actual service for the term of 11 months and 5 days the 30th of June 1802 at Fort Wilkerson as it will appear by the discharge hereto transmitted, and the Declarant further states that she is unable to come to court to make out her declaration through old age and infirmity and that she and Hosea Carlisle was marriage on the 1779 by one John Robertson justice of the peace, and that her name before marriage was Margaret Stewart they was married in the County of Moore North Carolina, and that Hosea Carlisle died in Jackson County and State of Georgia at home [on] or about the 20th of August 1837 as will more fully appear by reference to [indecipherable word] hereto annexed, and she further swears that she has no Court [indecipherable word] no family Record of the date of her marriage nor the date of the death of her husband. State of Georgia Jackson County: In person appeared before me a justice of the peace in and for the County aforesaid Margaret Carlisle aged 87 years old a resident of the County and State aforesaid the widow of Hosea Carlisle deceased who being duly sworn in terms of the wall saith that she is the identical widow of Hosea Carlisle who served in the Revolutionary War under Captain Cobb and commanded by Colonel Gaites and other officers that said Hosea Carlisle enlisted 1784 for the Term of 5 years or during the war, and served on or about 17__ and was honorably discharged which is now of file in the Pension office at Washington city with other affidavits in relation to Pension Claim, and she further states that [one or more indecipherable words] Hosea Carlisle ever any pay of any kind for service she never knew a [indecipherable word].
