Personally appeared before me Joshua P. Shropshire one of the Justices of the Inferior Court of said State and County aforesaid Silvey West a resident of said State in the County of Fayette and State aforesaid aged ninety six years who first being duly sworn according to Law doth on her oath make the Following Declaration in provisions made by the act of Congress passed on the 3d day of February Eighteen hundred and fifty three granting Pensions to Widows of persons [persons] who Served during the Revolutionary War - That she is the Widow of Willis West who served as a private in the Revolutionary war who went into service from North Carolina Blayden County [Bladen County] in about the year Seventeen hundred and seventy nine to the best of my recollection and did serve Eighteen Months in the war as a private Soldier all the time under Captain Roundtree was his Captain during his services that he died [done] in the war.

She further declares that to the best of his recollection West Returned from his Service in the war about the year seventeen hundred and Eighty or Eighty one. She further declares that She was Married to the Said Willis West in Sampson County North Carolina in our about October 1789 in Seventeen hundred and Eighty nine and that his said husband died on the twenty third day of November Eighteen hundred and Thirty Seven in Fayette County Georgia and that she was married to the said Willis West according to Law at the time above Stated and dates and that she has no minor children She further declares that She is Now the Widow of Willis West Deceased Sworn to and Subscribed on the day and year above written Before Me this the 6 day of
