Pension Application of Frederick Dunavent R3120

Power of Attorney.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: THAT I, Walter Dunavent of the county of Surry and State of North Carolina the Son of Frederick Dunavent whose claim for a pension under the Act of Congress approved the 7th day of June 1832, is now suspended for proof, and who died on the 16th day of August 1841, do hereby constitute and appoint J. W. Stevens of Abingdon Va. my true and lawful Attorney irrevocably for me, and in my name and place, to examine all the records, letters, affidavits, and other documents and papers connected with the aforesaid suspended claim now on file in the Pension Office, as well as all the Muster Rolls and other records that may show the Revolutionary services of the said Frederick Dunavent and generally to do all lawful acts and things whatsoever touching the premises in order to prosecute said claim to some result: hereby revoking all powers of Attorney heretofore given for a like purpose, and confirming whatsoever my said attorney shall, in my name, legally do in the premises: In testimony whereof, I hereunto set my hand and seal this the 24th day of Feb 1858

County of Surry } on this day [24 Feb 1858] personally appeared before me a justice of the peace for the County aforesaid John Bevel and Elizabeth Dunavent who in due and solemn form of law doth on their oaths declare that Warter T. Dunavent is believed to be the son of Frederick Dunavent and the only heir now living and according to the best information we can get Frederick Dunavent and Martha Bevel was Married about or in the spring of 1795. Frederick Dunavent Died in 1841 Aug. 16th. Martha Dunavent Died in the Spring of 1802. Frederick Dunavent Died Amelia County Va. to the best of it [signed] John Bevel Elizabeth herXmark Dunavent
