Pension Application of Josiah Dunn R3145

Columbia County } On this the sixth day of February 1856, personally come before me, James M Anthony a Judge of the Inferior Court for and in said County & State Stephen Drane Admr. on the estate of Capt Josiah Dunn late of this County Deceased, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath say, in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7th 1832, that, he is the Admr on the estate of Josiah Dunn, as will appear by his letters hereunto attached, that, he has no evidence the said Dunn was ever paid for his services, that, he thinks said Dunn served at Kings Mountain [7 Oct 1780], Augusta, Ogeechee, & other places, and, was killed at Wrightsboro Geo. and, he further says, the said Dunn was a raticent man & he refers to the records of Georgia, the evidence of John Mtson [?: see below] on file, & also, of Isaac Brooks to prove he was in service. The period of his death, will be [illegible word] proven to the Department when required, & the Administrator claims a full settlement under the act of 1832, and, he has no proof other than he has cited that, he now knows of & he hereby relinquishes all claim he has except the present, in the name of Josiah Dunn as far as in him lies as Administrator.
