At a court held for Accomack County on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of August 1832.

Maddox Fisher of the County of Accomack this day personally appeared in court and made the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed on the 7<sup>th</sup> of June 1832 viz:

Declaration of Maddox Fisher on this the      day of August 1832 personally appeared in open court before the Court of the County of Accomack in the state of Virginia now sitting, **Maddox Fisher**, a resident in the county of Accomack and state of Virginia of age seventy three years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832: I entered in a company of militia commanded by Capt. Wm Christian in January 1777 and mustered in the said company about two years and then went up to the county of Accomack to live and was enrolled in a company of militia commanded by Capt. Wm Justice January 1<sup>st</sup> 1779 & continued in the said company till the end of the war. I was born in the county of Northampton in the state of Virginia, June fifty nine. I have no record of my age but I have seen it in my Father's Bible that my brother when I was living in the county of Northampton in the state of Virginia. I have lived in the County of Accomack ever since the Revolutionary War & still.

At a court held for Accomack County on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of March 1851.

It is ordered to be certified that it appears to the court by satisfactory evidence that Maddox Fisher who made his declaration in Court on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of August 1832 in order to obtain the benefit of the act of June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832, was a resident of the county and died in the same county and state on March 31<sup>st</sup> day, 1834 and that he has no widow living.

I Robert Chase, aged upwards of ninety years, a Revolutionary soldier and a pensioner of the United States do hereby certify that I was acquainted with Maddox Fisher. I lived in the immediate neighborhood with him. I know he performed military duty in the company of Captain Wm Justice in which he was enrolled. I am satisfied all the militia companies in my part of the county and I believe in others were on duty at various times during the war of the revolution in keeping guard marching &c. more than two years. As Maddox Fisher was a young man at that time and enrolled in the company of Wm Justice, which was often on duty, I am satisfied that he served in military duty more than two years, but the exact time he did serve I will not after this long period of time undertake to say.
