State of Tennessee } On this Twentieth day of November One thousand Eight Hundred and fifty five  
Greene County      } personally come before me One of the Justices of the Peace for the County of  
Greene and State aforesaid Sarah Gallimore aged Eighty three years widow of Abraham Gallimore  
deceased who first being duly Sworn according to Law doth on her Oath make the following declaration  
in order to obtain the benefits of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed on the fourth of July  
1836 Extended by an act 21 of July 1848 and further Extended by an act 22 of Febuary 1841 and further  
Extended by an act approved 3<sup>rd</sup> of Febuary 1853 Granting pensions to widows of persons who served in  
the Revolutionary War that she is the widow of Abraham Gallimore who was a private in Capt. Hammy  
Company Chief Commander General Washington that he was drafted in the State of Virginia Franklin  
County [formed from Bedford and Henry counties in 1786] the month and year I am not able to State and  
fought in the battel at Little York against Cornwallis [siege of Yorktown, 28 Sep - 19 Oct 1781]

She further declairs that She was married to the said Abraham Gallimore in Franklin County  
State of Virginia on or about in the yeare of 1793 as well as I recollect that her said Husband died in the  
yeare 1840 May the 10<sup>th</sup> She further declairs that she can not obtain publick record of her marriage nor  
private record of her marriage      Sarah herXmark Gallimore
