State of Indiana Franklin County

On this ?th day of October 1832 personally appeared in open Court before the Honorable Judges of the Franklin Circuit Court now in session Uriah Leftter a resident of said County & State above written aged eighty-two years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed June 7th, 1832. That he enlisted in the Army of the United States in the year 1777 with Lieutenant Baker and served in the 7th Regiment of the North Carolina line, under the following named officers: Colonel Hogan [sic, James Hogun] & Captain Dickson; left the service aforesaid in the fall of 1779; lived in Hartford County [sic, Hertford County] North Carolina when he entered the service; and in Monmouth, Jermantown [Germantown] and Liberty Pole battles; marched through the States of North Carolina, Virginia, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York and various others not recollected. He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any Agency in any State

I William Hill Secretary of State in and for the State aforesaid, do certify, that it appears from the musterrolls of the Continental line of this State in the revolutionary War, that Uriah Leftyear a private in Captain Walker's Company of the 7th Regiment enlisted on the 19th day of March 1777 for 3 years or the war deserted on the 26th day of March 1779.
