[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]



State of Indiana Orange County 30th of April 1832 this day personally came William More [sic, William Moore]¹ before me Samuel Wible the Justice of the peace for said County and after being duly sworn according to law deposes and saith as follows that he knew of Mr. Henry Marley serving a tour of duty in the land service of the United States in the revolutionary war under the command of Col. Luttrell [sic, John Luttrell] in the year of our Lord 1781 further the deponent saith not

April the 5 1832

This day personally came Frances Domet [sic, Francis Dorsett] before me S. Hoggatt a Justice of the peace for said County and made oath that he saw Henry Marley in the land service and knew of his serving three months tour of duty in the revolutionary war under the command of Col. Luttrell in the year A.D. 1781
