State of North Carolina County of Davie

On this 14th day of September 1858 personally appeared before me, an acting Justice of the Peace, James D. Frost Administrator of Margery Robison, a resident of said County and State, aged 21 years who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed on the \_\_\_ day of \_\_\_, granting pensions to widows of persons who served during the Revolutionary war: That letters of administration upon the State of Margery Robison deceased were granted to him the said James D. Frost, by the Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions of Rowan County at its May Term A.D. 1858; and that he gave bond and duly qualified as such: That said Margery Robison was the widow of Henry Robison deceased, who was a private in the Revolutionary War, and served more than 6 months -- the exact time not known, who served 6 weeks in General Pickens Regiment and was honorably discharged on the 6 [illegible] March 1781 -- as by his original certificate of Discharge he with said, fully appears: who afterwards performed a tour of duty under General Griffith \_\_\_ as by his original certificate of discharge, dated September 28th 1781 will more fully appear. He further declares that the said Margery was married to the said Henry Robison, on the 15th day of January in the year 1795, in the County of Rowan and State of North Carolina, and that her name previous to her marriage was Margery Andrews; and that he has no other proof of said marriage and that here with presented: that her said husband died in the County of Rowan State of North Carolina, on the 11th day of November 1823; that she was not married to him prior to the year \_\_\_ hundred and \_\_\_, but at the time above stated. He further declares that the said Margery Robison died in the County of Rowan & State of North Carolina on the 16th day of September A.D. 1847, and he further declares that he derived the information as to the marriage and death of said Henry and Margery Robison from the entries recorded in the Family Bible, and believe the same correct. Sworn to and subscribed on the day and year above written before the Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions of said County, now sitting and it is hereby certified that the applicant is a credible person, etc.

On this the 14th day of September A.D. 1858, personally appeared before me C. H. Etchison & J G Clifford and after being duly sworn according to law deposeth as follows  
That they have examined and compared the entries copied below with the entries in the

old Bible which purports to be and by these affiant's is supposed to be the Family Bible of the late injury Robinson and Margery Robinson viz.:

"Henry Robison married Margery Andrews January 15th 1795"

"In memory of the Death of Henry Robison who departed this life on Tuesday night about 7 o'clock on the 11th of November 1823."

"In memory of the death of Margaret Robison who departed this life on Tuesday about 30 minutes after 7 o'clock on the 16th day of September in the year of our Lord 1847, in the 77th year of her age."

That the above quoted entries are correctly copied from the said Bible and are correct as these affiant's believe.

They further declare that they are disinterested in the said claim, in all respects
