

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of Georgia Habersham County: SS: Inferior Court Call Term.

On this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of April 1853 Personally appeared in open Court now sitting Zebedee Savage a resident of Hall County, State of Georgia aged Seventy-five years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7, 1832. That he is the son of Thomas Savage who informed him that he performed a large amount of service in the Revolutionary war in the State of North Carolina and never drew a pension in his lifetime and he, the said Zebedee Savage now applies for the pension due him at his death. He also further declares that according to the information he has received from his father that he [was] married to June Taylor on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of June 1775 in the State of North Carolina and that from the marriage he the said Zebedee was born and was seven years old at the close of the war and that his father the said Thomas Savage died in Hall County State of Georgia on the first day of May 1839 leaving no widow, and that he the said Zebedee is the only heir that he knows to be living. He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or an annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency in any State, and that he was compelled to make his application in another county because he was unable to get an agent in his own County. Sworn to and subscribed in open court the day and year above written.


