Pension Application of Amos Graham S13204

This day Amos Graham a soldier of the Revolution came before me a Justice of the peace and made oath to the following statement viz. I volunteered in the Militia Service of The State of Virginia in the fall 1776 under Capt Barnett and served a three months Tour against the Cherokee Indians in which we burn several of the Indian Towns and again in the year 1777 I volunteerd under Capt Easton of Col Hugh Crockett Regiment and served two tours of three months each making six months to guard the lead mines [near Fort chiswell in present Wythe County] on New River waters viz Stock creek, and again I entered the company of Capt McClanahan [sic: William McClenahan] of Col Campbells [William Campbell's] Regiment and was in the battle [of] Guilford [Guilford Courthouse NC, 15 Mar 1781] at which time I served three months making in the whole twelve months of malitia service in the Militia of the State of Virginia, and I was a faithful soldier during the whole time of each tour and was honorably discharged from the same at the end of each term – but I have long since lost or mislaid my discharges and I am not now neither have I ever been a pensioner on the U States and I hereby release all other claims to a pension, I am now in my 72^d year of age and infirm, Therefore I pray that a Pension be allowed. Witness my hand this 10 day of July 1832
