



and lived two years, and from thence moved to Russell County on Clinch river in Virginia and lived thirteen years, and then moved to Floyd County Kentucky and lived four years, and then moved back to Russell County and lived three years and moved back to Morgan County Kentucky and lived eight years, and then moved to Franklin County Indiana where he has since resided & where he now resides.

4. He was drafted and volunteered as aforesaid & as hereinafter stated.

5. He was acquainted with Dillard Capt. Joseph Roberts Lt. Col. Cleavland[sic: Benjamin Cleveland], Col Isaacs, Col. Herndon, Gen. Rutherford, &c.

6. He never received a discharge

7. He is acquainted with William George & Daniel St. John of Franklin County and who is acquainted with me & who can testify as to my character for veracity 7c.

He also recollects, that after he had served the two weeks under Capt Herndon & before the time he served as a Sergeant for three months as herein before stated, he was drafted for six weeks under Capt John Morgan, and served the full term of six weeks as a private soldier, he does not recollect the precise day when he entered or quit the service this tour, but it was between the time before stated and served as a private soldier seven months and three weeks instead of six months and one week as once before in this Declaration stated and three months as a first Sergeant. He knows of no person whose testimony he can procure who can testify to his service.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state

NOTE: On 21 Jan 1843 Collyer applied to have his pension transferred to Missouri, having moved to Grundy County because "his children was moving from Indiana to Missouri and that he was Unsettled had no land in Indiana." On 26 June 1845 Collyer again applied to have his pension transferred, having moved to Mercer County MO because "he was unsettled in Indiana and owned no land and his Children had Generally moved to Missouri."
