[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

Missouri territory Christopher Mourning – private Army US – Duplicate certificate of pension issued the 12th April 1819 & sent to Aug. Chouteau President Bank of Missouri & Agent for paying US Pensioners St. Louis

Transferred from the roll of North Carolina to Missouri to take effect from the 4th September 1817

At \$3.33 1/3 per month increased to \$5.33 1/3 by law of 24 April 1816

The within named Christopher Mourning was originally placed on the North Carolina at the rate of \$3.33 1/3 in his pension was increased by the law of the 24th of April 1816 to \$5.33 1/3 per month to take effect from the passage of that act; his name was transferred from the roll of North Carolina to that of Missouri Territory Agency to take effect on the 4th day of September 1817
