
Pension Application of William Dolby S25033

State of Maryland, Baltimore County Ss:

On this Twenty Eighth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, personally appeared before me the undersigned Justice of the peace in and for said County William Dalby, or Dolby, and made oath on the holy evangely of almighty God, that he is the same person who is placed on the Pension List of the United States, "in conformity with the Law of the United States" and agreeably to the certificate hereunto annexed or attached, signed "John Stockton, and that he received his last payment of Eight dollars per month at New Castle in the state of Delaware on the fifth day of March last past.

I hereby respectfully request that my pension of Eight dollars pr month may be transferred from New Castle in the State of Delaware to the Maryland agency at the Br. Bank of the U.S. at Baltimore, and a certificate thereof forwarded to me directed to the care of Thomas Bailey No. 6 Harrison Street Balt'e"
[signed 28 July 1818] William Dolby

These are to Certify That William Dalby a Soldier late of the Eleventh Virginia Regiment in the Revolutionary Army of the United States of America, and receives sixty dollars per year.
