Pension Application of Jonathan Dyer S25046

We do hereby certify that we have examined Jonathan Dyer who we suppose to be between 70 & 80 years of age has lost his right leg & his left has an ulcer of several years standing and are of the opinion that he is unable to support himself [signed] Geo. Craghead Tho Anderson

His name appears on a list of applicants for invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of Virginia submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on Feby 28, 1795 and printed in the American State Papers class 9, page 164

Rank; Private.

Reg't; 1st Maryland regiment, Captain Paroll's company

Disability; Lost his leg at the battle of Eutaw [Eutaw Springs SC, 8 Sep 1781]

When and where disabled; September 9 [sic], 1781, Eutaw

Residence; County of Pittsylvania

Monthly allowance; \$4.16 $\frac{2}{3}$.

Arrearages; \$200.00

Remarks; Enlisted March 22, for the war; wounded September 9, 1781 and sent to the hospital

Evidence complete, excepting that the examining physicians do not precisely state the degree of his disability

NOTES:

The file contains a document dated 29 Nov 1820 stating that Jonathan Dyer had lived in Pittsylvania County for seven years and in Halifax County VA before then.

Also in the file is a document relating to a different Jonathan Dyer, pension application S28718.
