Pension Application of Solomon Bishop S30863

State of Kentucky } Personally appeared before me the subscriber a Justice of the Peace in and for
Nelson County } said County Solomon Bishop a resident Citizen of said County who being duly
sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of
the provision made by the Act of Congress passed June the 7th 1832 saith that he is now seventy seven
years of age that he inlisted in the year 1775 under Capt Morgan Alexander of the 2nd Va State Regiment
for the period of one year and faithfully served his time out when he again reenlisted in the same
Regiment and under Capt. Marquis Calmes [pension application S12674] formerly Lieut under Capt
[Morgan] Alexander for the term of three years and faithfully served out his term of enlistment when he
was honorably discharged that his discharge was sent to Richmond Virginia where he received a land
warrant for one hundred acres of land for said service. he says that his residence was in Frederick County
Virginia that Col Spottswood [sic: Alexander Spotswood] Commanded the said Regiment a part of the
time he also says that he was in the Battles of Brandywine [11 Sep 1777] Germantown [4 Oct 1777] and
Monmouth [28 June 1778] He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the
present and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency in any state and further that
from bodily infirmity having lost by a parallitick stroke one half or one side of him that he is unable to
make his declaration in open court and further he saith not
Sworn and subscribed before me this 25th of July 1832

This day General Marquis Calmes who was a Captain of the Second Virginia Regiment on
continental establishment of General Woodfords Brigade appeared before the undersigned a Justice of the
Peace in and for said County and made Oath that Solomon Bishop was an enlisted soldier in his company
for three years or during the war he does not recollect which he is confident the said Bishop served two
or more years before he deponent left the service he also says he is informed said Bishop is now living in
said State and further saith not Given under my hand this 20th day of June 1832
