Pension Application of Jarvis Bromagen S30895

State of Kentucky } S.S.

County of Bath }

On this 11th day of November [1833] appeared in open Court before us members of the County Court of Bath now sitting Jarvis Bromegine resident of said County and State aged 71 years who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following decleration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832 That he entered the Service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated –

In the year 1779 [sic] I entered the Service as a volunteer under the Command of Capt James Brinton for the Term of four months and served out my time and was discharged I do not recolect the name of our Majr our Col was John Evans my Term of Service commenced in the month of September or October 1779 we were marched in said company from Morgantown to the mouth of Big River [probably Big Beaver River at Beaver PA, Sep 1778] on the Ohio River and there joined the army under Genl [Lachlan] McIntosh and built a Garrison and called it the same name as our General and from there I was marched with said Army to the head of the Muskingum where we built another fort called fort Lawrence [sic: Fort Laurens near present Bolivar OH, Nov 1778 - Jan 1779] from there we were marched back to Fort McIntosh and from thence we were ordered home and discharged I served in that expedition four months

In the month of March or April 1780 I again entered the service at the same place under the command of Capt William Hayman [William Haymond] as a drafted man for the Term of two months and served out my time and was discharged –

I had no written discharges for the above services I was born in the year 1762 I never had any record of my age I was living in Morgantown County of Monongliala [sic: Monongalia] state of Virginia when called into service I moved from thence to Bourbon County Kentucky where I lived five years I then moved to Bath County Kentucky where I have resided ever since making altogether thirty five years in the State of Kentucky

And I hereby relinquish every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension Roll of the agency of any State –

NOTE: J. T. McAllister in *Virginia Militia in the Revolutionary War* shows the name Jarvis Brumagen on the payroll of Capt. William Haymond's company at Pickett's Fort near Morgantown 15 Apr - 12 Jun 1777.
