
Pension Application of David Jameson: S31167

State of Kentucky, County of Bourbon

To wit On the 13th day of August 1832 personally appeared before the Circuit Court of the County of Bourbon aforesd. David Jameson a resident of the State and County aforesd. who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed on June 7 1832. That he enlisted in the army of the United States in the fall of the year 1775 in the 12th Virginia Regiment under Shadrack Harriman recruiting officer. The following named persons were his officers--Matthew Arbuckle Capt. Andrew Wallace (?) 1st Lieut.--Saml. Word (Ward? or Wood?) 2nd Lieut.--John Galloway ensign. He will be seventy six years old 10th day of March next. He enlisted in Greenbriar County [Greenbrier County] Virginia. He was marched to Pittsburg from which place he went by water to the mouth of the Kenawha [Kanawha River] where at Point Pleasant Garrison He served out his term of one year that being the time for which he enlisted. At the expiration of the term, he enlisted for a term of two years more and served out the same at the aforesd. Garrison of Point Pleasant. His first term of one year commenced in March 1776. At Pittsburg the company to which he belonged was put under the command of Col. John Nevel [John Neville]. He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present & that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency in any state. Sworn to & subscribed the day & year aforesd.
