

State of Georgia County of Habersham: SS On the 19th day of November 1832 personally appeared in open court before the Court of Ordinary of said County now sitting Thomas Crumly a resident of said County and State aged seventy years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7th 1832. That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated. He entered the service in the State of North Carolina in McLenburg [sic, Mecklenburg County] in the year 1781 under Captain Charles Gordon Major Joel Lewis in the North Carolina State Regiment and served for the term of twelve months and was regularly discharged by Major Joel Lewis he entered and served as a substitute for Theodorick Webb in the militia and his discharge is hereto annexed he was during the time of his service marched to Augusta in Georgia as one of the guard sent with some ammunition he was born as he has been informed in the State of Virginia in Frederick County in the year 1762 in March he lived at the time he was called into service in North Carolina he removed to South Carolina after receiving his discharge to Newberry District he then removed to Spartanburg South Carolina from there he removed to Buncombe County North Carolina thence to Habersham County Georgia where he has resided ever since. He has no record of his age in his possession. He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any Agency of any State. Sworn to and subscribed the day and year aforesaid.



[fn p. 6: On October 1, 1852 in Union County, Georgia, power of attorney given by Hannah Berry, 64, a resident of Lumpkin County Georgia and the daughter and one of the legal heirs of Thomas Crumley; she states he died in the month of March 1836; that her mother Ruth Crumley died in the month of March 1837; that her parents were residents of Habersham County Georgia at the time they died

[Veteran was pensioned at the rate of \$40 per annum commencing March 4th, 1831, full one-year service as a private in the North Carolina militia.]
