Pension Application of Henry Cloyer (Clower) S35838

The State of Indiana }  
Jefferson County. Ss. }            On this day towit, the twelfth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & nineteen personally appeared before me the subscriber One of the Judges of the Jefferson Circuit Court Henry Cloyer aged Seventy five years – Resident of the County of Jefferson & State of Indiana who being by me first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress Entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war. that he the said Henry Cloyer Enlisted at the warm Springs in the State of Virginia in the year Seventy Six in the Company commanded by Capt. [Andrew] Hinds in the Regiment Commanded by Colo. Rollins and that he continued to serve for the term of ten months when he was discharged at Philadelphia in the state of Pennsylvania and that he is in Reduced Circumstances & stands in need of the assistance of his Country for support & that he has no other Evidence of his services now in his power

On this 28<sup>th</sup> day of October 1820 Personally appeared in open Court being a court of record expressly made and created by the Constitution and laws of said state by the name & style of the Jefferson Circuit Court of the second judicial circuit Henry Cloyer aged eighty years resident in Jefferson County in said district who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows. in Col. Robbins, Reg't. Capt. Andrew Hines Company, date of original certificate 12<sup>th</sup> January 1819 & has been inscribed on the pension roll the number of which is as marked on the back of same 7179. And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain person engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

Real estate I have none,

Personal property One blind mare.

Occupation a farmer, but not able to pursue it

I have none in my family but my wife & she is blind.
