

Jefferson County }

On this twenty fourth day of August 1818 before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Jefferson Circuit court of the third circuit of the state of Indiana aforesaid personally appears John Field aged sixty six years & upwards resident in the county of Jefferson aforesaid in the said Circuit who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his Oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war." That he the said John Field enlisted in Bedford County & state of Virginia in the company commanded by Captain Joseph Crocket [sic: Joseph Crockett] of the Seventh Regiment of the Virginia continental line That he continued to serve in said corps for two years making one continued service until the time of his discharge which was nine months or thereabouts after the battle of Brandywine [11 Sep 1777] and at the Valley forge in Pennsylvania That he was in the battle of Brandywine & some other small skirmishes. That he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the aid of his country for support & that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services
