
[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indcipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of Kentucky Pendleton County: June Term

On this 15 day of June 1818 before the Court of Pendleton County personally appeared Charles Love age sixty-five years resident in Pendleton County and State aforesaid who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by an act of Congress entitled an Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval Service of the United States in the revolutionary War –

That he the said Charles Love entered the service of the United States as a Substitute in the room of Bean Smallwood in Captain Thomas Berry's Company of the 8<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment commanded by Colonel Bowman [Abraham Bowman] and in General Charles Scott's Brigade he entered the service sometime in March in the year 1777 at Philadelphia and was discharged at Valley Forge on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of March 1778 and was in the battle of Germantown [October 4, 1777] and at Brandywine [September 11, 1777] and from his Reduced Circumstances needs the Assistance of his Country for support.

Michael Dean<sup>1</sup> a credible Witness appeared before me Robert Taylor a justice of the peace for the County of Pendleton and State of Kentucky & made oath that Charles Love was a Continental Soldier in Captain Thomas Berry's Company for one year which time he served & was Honorably Discharged at Valley Forge Captain Berry belonged to the 8<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment commanded by Colonel Bowman & in the year 1777 as well as he remembers.

This 9<sup>th</sup> day of June 1819 Beane Smallwood<sup>2</sup> a credible witness appeared before me Isaac Gray 8 Justice of the peace for the County of Bath and State of Kentucky and made oath that Charles Love was a Continental Soldier in Captain Thomas Beries [sic] Company for one-year in the 8<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment commanded by Colonel Bowman in the year 1777 –  
Given under my hand the day above written

[Veteran was pensioned at the rate of \$8 per month commencing June 15, 1818, for service as a private for one-year in the Virginia Continental line.]
